WNY PRISM Hemlock Woolly Adelgid Hunters Training

The eastern hemlock is a hugely important tree species upon which entire ecosystems depend. Unfortunately, these majestic trees and the numerous benefits they provide are threatened by the hemlock woolly adelgid (HWA), an invasive, aphid-like insect.

Slowing the spread of HWA is one of the best ways we can help preserve our hemlocks. Early detection of emerging infestations is a great way to do this, but we need volunteers like you to help! **Join WNY PRISM’s Hemlock Woolly Adelgid Hunters Program to learn how to identify, survey for and report HWA, and then adopt a location to survey this winter!**



This event will feature an indoor training at the library followed by an outdoor portion to practice how to survey for and report HWA. Please be prepared to spend time outdoors with appropriate clothing and footwear.
