WNY PRISM Crew Assistance Program 2026 Request for Proposals

The Western New York Partnership for Regional Invasive Species Management (WNY PRISM) is seeking proposals for the 2026 Crew Assistance Program. The Crew Assistance Program (CAP) provides partners with assistance implementing invasive species surveys, invasive species removal projects and restoration efforts, through use of our trained, seasonal staff. The WNY PRISM Crew is available for projects from late-May through September. WNY PRISM expects to select between 6 – 8 projects in 2026. Applicants should ensure their proposals include all required information and address criteria for selection. Incomplete proposals may not be considered, and projects will be selected based on how well they address the established review criteria. Partners may submit multiple, separate project proposals for consideration. Questions about this program may be directed to Catherine Eaton at eatonc@buffalostate.edu. Eligibility:

The Crew Assistance Program is open to all WNY PRISM partners, as defined in our <u>Operational Guidelines</u>. Project sites must fall within the 8 counties of WNY PRISM (Allegany, Cattaraugus, Chautauqua, Erie, Genesee, Niagara, Orleans and Wyoming Counties).

Partner Expectations:

- Partners are expected to communicate and work directly with WNY PRISM on the project and how you
 propose to do this should be included within your proposal.
- Partners are expected to meet the Crew when they arrive on-site for the first day of work and are expected to provide a brief introduction and direct them to the project site.
- Partners are expected to provide public acknowledgement of WNY PRISM's efforts through project outreach. This may include social media posts, blog posts, newsletter articles, or presentations, and how you will acknowledge WNY PRISM should be included in your proposal.

Permits:

New York State recently updated their wetland regulations, requiring additional steps to determine if a permit is needed. If your project involves invasive species removal near or adjacent to water, we recommend requesting a Jurisdictional Determination (JD) for the tax parcel(s) included in the project area as early as possible. More information on this, as well as the JD Request Form, can be found at DEC Freshwater Wetland Jurisdictional Determination.

Pesticide Application:

WNY PRISM may apply herbicides on terrestrial sites only, in accordance with New York State Pesticide Application Laws. Terrestrial applications may take place within wetland or riparian areas, however no applications may occur over water, standing or otherwise. Permits may be required to implement herbicide treatments. It is the responsibility of the partner to obtain any necessary permits, but WNY PRISM may be able to assist with permit applications.

Plan to complete your work in one sitting to avoid your data from being lost. Applications are final once you select "submit" at the end of the form and no edits can be made at this point. All proposals must be received by 5:00 PM on Friday, January 30, 2026.

WNY PRISM Crew Assistance Program Review Criteria

WNY PRISM is seeking projects through which we work with partners to address invasive species priorities, to improve, restore and protect local aquatic and terrestrial resources. Projects may include invasive species survey efforts that will drive future management efforts, invasive species management projects that support previous contractor work on site or projects that fit into long-term site management and/or restoration efforts. Examples of past projects can be viewed on our Crew Assistance Program webpage. Each project proposal will be reviewed for consistency with our Strategic Plan. Eligible proposals found to be consistent with the WNY PRISM Strategic Plan will be reviewed by WNY PRISM staff and Steering Committee based on the following criteria:

Program Priorities

- Invasive Species Targets
 - Species priorities are based on the <u>WNY PRISM Tier Rankings</u>, where Tier 1 and Tier 2 species are the highest priority, and Tier 4 the lowest. They are further identified within WNY PRISM's priority species lists.
 - Species that are new to the property in question and do not have well-established source populations and/or seedbanks present.
- Conservation Targets
 - Project areas of high conservation value including unique habitats and communities, rare, threatened and endangered species.
 - Project sites with low invasive species cover, areas with low probability of re-invasion, and areas with lower human impact pressures and disturbance.
 - o Projects that are within areas under a form of permanent protection.
- Project Sustainability
 - Projects that include use of best management practices and effective strategies to control target invasive species.
 - Projects that present a clear plan for either how survey data will be used for future management efforts or how management efforts will be sustained long-term.
 - Projects that demonstrate a clear plan for continued monitoring and management, after WNY
 PRISM has completed involvement in the project.
 - Projects that only require a single year of WNY PRISM assistance. If it is a multi-year project, include information on how the project will be completed if WNY PRISM assistance is not available in subsequent years.

Partnership

• Projects that further strengthen our partnership network where we work alongside our partners to reach common goals.

- Projects that help build regional capacity for improved and expanded management efforts.
- o Additive projects that may not be implemented through use of current partner resources.

 - o For removal projects include information on the infestation (size, density, age class, how long its been established, etc.).
- Additional invasive species present on site or nearby.
- Summary of relevant, survey, removal or restoration work recently completed, or ongoing, at the
- How you will be supporting the project (i.e. site preparation, providing staff, providing supplies and/or equipment).
- How you plan to continue and/or maintain management progress.
- How you will publicly acknowledge WNY PRISM's efforts.
